Why are we studying PFAS?

Your community asked for this study. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR) responded to your concerns about whether PFAS exposure may lead to specific diseases with the Pease Study. In May 2014, drinking water wells that supply the Tradeport were sampled, and one well showed elevated levels. The well has since been disconnected from the system.

The Pease Study will help us learn if PFAS exposure may lead to:

-  Higher cholesterol levels
-  Lower vaccine response in children
-  Specific diseases related to changes in liver, thyroid, or kidney function
-  Increased risk of high blood pressure (or pre-eclampsia) in pregnant women
-  Greater risk of ulcerative colitis
-  ADHD (hyperactivity) in children
